Robust student government this year with good student representation. Priorities for this year: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> People not politicians; want to see change; familiar faces. Bridging the gap (understanding what ASOSU does) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Communicate the impact we have on student fees. Write policies to propose to university leadership. Take a proactive approach to inform student body. Mental health accessibility. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Identity based counselors – now in CAPS.
